- Dress code requires modest, decent and proper attire in church, since the Presence of God is here. Traditionally, Catholics will wear their **Sunday Best.** Ladies and girls please wear a **head-covering** and a dress that goes well below the knees when sitting. Men and boys please do not wear sports clothes or athletic shoes at Sunday Mass

Sacramental information:

Baptism: Registered faithful only. Please contact the office to arrange the date. Normally no baptisms on Sundays. Godparents must be traditional practicing Catholics at least 16 years old.

Confirmation: We will let you know when the Bishop will be coming. Be prepared by studying the catechism. Sponsors must be traditional practicing Catholics at least 16 years old. To enroll in Sunday program; see Mr. Craig Wilkerson via office. Email: catechism@ourladyofsorrows.org

Confessions: Times as listed, plus by consultation with one of the priests. Please try to come during the week if you live nearby. Be clear, complete, concise and contrite.

Marriages: Priest needs at least six months notice. This sacrament is only for those who registered faithful. Normally no weddings on Sundays.

Last Rites: Contact office or one of the priests. Sick calls are for those who are registered faithful. Emergency phone number for urgent cases only.

Epiphany Blessing of Home

Take the blessed chalk and first write the initials of the three Wise Men, connected with Crosses, over the inside of your front door (on the lintel, if possible). Then write the year, breaking up the numbers and the year so that they fall on both sides of the initials.

It should look like this: **20 C+M+B 20**

with the "20" being the millennium and century, the "C" standing for the first Wise Man, Caspar, the "M" standing for Melchior, the "B" standing for Balthasar, and the "20" standing for the decade and year. It is also popularly believed that the Kings' initials also stand for "Christus mansionem benedicat" ("Christ bless this house").
