- Please remember that reception of **Holy Communion is reserved for baptized Catholics who are in the state of grace and fasting.**
- Dress code requires modest, decent and proper attire in church, since the Presence of God is here. Traditionally, Catholics will wear their **Sunday Best**. Ladies and girls please wear a **head-covering** and a dress that goes well below the knees when sitting. Men and boys please do not wear sports clothes or athletic shoes at Sunday Mass

Sacramental information:

Baptism: Registered faithful only. Please contact the office to arrange the date. Normally no baptisms on Sundays. Godparents must be traditional practicing Catholics at least 16 years old.

Confirmation: We will let you know when the Bishop will be coming. Be prepared by studying the catechism. Sponsors must be traditional practicing Catholics at least 16 years old. To enroll in Sunday program; see Mr. Craig Wilkerson via office. Email: catechism@ourladyofsorrows.org

Confessions: Times as listed, plus by consultation with one of the priests. Please try to come during the week if you live nearby. Be clear, complete, concise and contrite.

Marriages: Priest needs at least six months notice. This sacrament is only for those who registered faithful. Normally no weddings on Sundays.

Last Rites: Contact office or one of the priests. Sick calls are for those who are registered faithful. Emergency phone number for urgent cases only.

On account of the recent scandals of the Amazon Synod in Rome, which promoted idolatry and attacked the holiness of the priesthood, the Superior General of the SSPX, Fr. How to obtain a plenary indulgence for the Holy Souls

From November 1-8: visit a cemetery and pray for the poor souls.

A partial indulgence can be obtained any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the poor souls. The following prayer is especially recommended:

*Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis.
Requiescant in pace. Amen.*

Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen

Six general rules for obtaining a plenary indulgence:

1. State of grace.
2. Complete detachment from sin, even venial sin.
3. Confession (8 days before or after the indulgenced act).
4. Communion (8 days before or after the indulgenced act).
5. Prayers for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.
6. Indulgenced act: a special good work with special conditions of place and time.
